## B. Submitting Comments

### II. Discussion

The NRC is issuing for public comment Draft Supplement 21, Second Renewal, to the GEIS for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants, NUREG—1437, regarding the proposed subsequent renewal of Renewed Facility Operating License Nos. DPR—33, DPR—52, and DPR—68, for an additional 20 years of operation for Browns Ferry. Draft Supplement 21, Second Renewal, to the GEIS includes a preliminary analysis that evaluates the environmental impacts of the proposed action and alternatives to the proposed action.

Based on the NRC staff's (i) review of the SLR application, which includes the environmental report, supplemental documents, and the licensee's responses to the NRC staff's requests for additional information; (ii) consultation with Federal, State, Tribal, and local governmental agencies and consideration of input from other stakeholders; and (iii) independent environmental review as documented in the draft environmental impact statement, the NRC staff's preliminary recommendation is that the adverse environmental impacts of SLR for Browns Ferry are not so great that preserving the option of subsequent license renewal for energy-planning decisionmakers would be unreasonable.
