#### Notice Pursuant to the National Cooperative Research and Production Act of 1993—National SPA and Pool Institute

Notice is hereby given that, on September 15, 2004, pursuant to section 6(a) of the National Cooperative Research and Production Act of 1993, 15 U.S.C. 4301 *et seq.* ("the Act"), the National Spa and Pool Institute ("NSPI") has filed written notifications simultaneously with the Attorney General and the Federal Trade Commission disclosing (1) the name and principal place of business of the standards development organization and (2) the nature and scope of its standards development activities. #### Notice Pursuant to the National Cooperative Research and Production Act of 1993—Semiconductor Research Corporation

The last notification was filed with the Department on January 6, 2001. A notice was published in the **Federal Register** pursuant to section 6(b) of the Act on March 8, 2001 (66 FR 13972).
